

The Nottinghamshire County Council (Great North Road, Main Street, Manor House Farm Bridge road and Norwell Lane, Cromwell) (30 M.P.H. Speed Limit) Restricted Road and Speed Limit Order 2018 (3280)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Nottinghamshire County Council proposes to make an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, Traffic Management Act 2004, as amended, and The Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (County of Nottinghamshire) Designation Order 2008 (SI 2008 No. 1086), as amended, the effects of which will be to roads in Cromwell in the District of Newark and Sherwood:-

- 1. The following lengths of road shall become a restricted road (with a speed limit of 30mph)
 - (i) Main Street/ Great North Road from a point 360 metres south of the centre line of the junction with Norwell Lane in a northerly direction to a point 13 metres south of the centre line of the junction with the Manor House Farm Bridge road.
 - (ii) **Norwell Lane** from its junction with Main Street/Great North Road in a westerly direction for a distance of 515 metres.
- 2. The following length of road shall have a speed limit of 30mph
 - (i) Main Street/ Great North Road from a point 13 metres south of the centre line of the junction with the Manor House Farm Bridge road in a northerly direction for a distance of 81 metres north of the same point.
 - (ii) Manor House Farm Bridge road from its junction with Main Street/Great North Road in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 28 metres (as measured along the south-eastern kerb line).

The new 30mph speed limit will replace the current 40mph speed limit in Cromwell. The 30mph speed limit is in keeping with other villages in Nottinghamshire and is the speed limit recommended by the Department of Transport. The lower speed limit is the most appropriate for a built up area. It is proposed to extend the 30mph speed limit at the northern end of the village.
