

PROVISION OF ZEBRA CROSSING

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Nottinghamshire County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 23 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (Zebra crossing), proposes to install a zebra pedestrian crossing across Cropwell Road, Radcliffe on Trent in the Borough of Rushcliffe approximately 8 metres south-east of its junction with Victoria Street, Radcliffe on Trent

The crossing will incorporate a controlled area indicated by zig-zag markings along the carriageway where parking and loading will be prohibited. The extents of the controlled area are: -

Cropwell Road – north-east side

from a point 5 metres north-west of its junction with Victoria Street in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 42 metres.

Cropwell Road – south-west side

from a point 6 metres north-west of a point opposite the north-eastern kerb line of its junction with Victoria Street in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 42 metres.

The crossing is being installed to assist pedestrians, especially school children, in crossing the road. In addition, the scheme includes no waiting at any time restrictions (double yellow lines).

Any comments/objections (quoting ref: Cropwell Road) in respect of the zebra crossing proposal must be received by me, in writing, by **30th October 2020**.

As a result of the impact of COVID-19 and in accordance with Public Health England's advice on social distancing and avoiding non-essential trips, public buildings such as County Hall libraries are closed or if reopened will have restrictions in place.
