**FLATTS LANE AND PEPPER ROAD, CALVERTON - PROPOSED PARKING RESTRICTIONS-  
TRO 7200 AND INSTALLATION OF ZEBRA CROSSING  
PUBLIC CONSULTATION**

Via East Midlands Ltd, working on behalf of Nottinghamshire County Council is proposing to introduce parking restrictions on Flatts Lane and Pepper Road and the installation of a Zebra crossing on Flatts Lane in Calverton.

On Flatts Lane the proposed parking restrictions are double yellow lines (no waiting at any time) on the western side of the road, 42m from the junction with Collyer Road and for a distance of 24m in a northerly direction. The parking restriction is being introduced to ensure that the road is kept clear for visibility of the zebra crossing and people waiting to cross.

On Pepper Road, for a distance of 18m from the junction with Flatts Lane, the proposed parking restrictions are double yellow lines (no waiting at any time) on both the north and south sides of the road. The parking restrictions is being introduced to ensure that the road is kept clear for visibility of the zebra crossing and people waiting to cross.

On Flatts Lane, the proposed zebra crossing will be located approximately 62 metres north of the junction with Collyer Road. The crossing will have a controlled area, indicated by zig-zag markings, along the carriageway where parking and loading will be prohibited. The location of the Zebra crossing is shown on the attached plan, EMD/20375/3.

As required under Section 23 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, I hereby enclose for your attention the statutory public notice stating the County Council's intention to introduce the Zebra crossing on Flatts Lane.

Before proceeding further with the proposed restrictions, I wish to consider the views of residents and organisations who may be interested in this matter. Suggestions will be incorporated in the proposal wherever appropriate and economically feasible. If your comments are in the form of an objection to the proposals and if they cannot be resolved, they will be reported through the County Council's procedures at the appropriate time. Any observations on these proposals should reach me by **7<sup>th</sup> December 2018**.
