

The Nottinghamshire County Council (Colwick Manor Farm, Crosslands Meadow, Mile End Road and Ramblers Close, Colwick)(Prohibition of Waiting) Traffic Regulation Order 2020 (7234)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Nottinghamshire County Council proposes to make an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, Traffic Management Act 2004, as amended, and The Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (County of Nottinghamshire) Designation Order 2008 (SI 2008 No. 1086), as amended, the effects of which will be to roads in Colwick in the Borough of Gedling:-

Proposed No waiting at any time restrictions (double yellow lines) at the following locations:-

- (i) <u>COLWICK MANOR FARM (both sides)</u> from its junction with Mile End Road in a northerly direction for 10 metres.
 - (ii) <u>CROSSLANDS MEADOW (both sides)</u> from its junction with Mile End Road in a southerly direction for 10 metres.
 - (iii) MILE END ROAD (the north side) from a point 10 metres west of its junction with Ramblers Close in an easterly direction to a point 10 metres east of the same junction.
 - (iv) from a point 17 metres west of its junction with Colwick Manor Farm in an easterly direction to a point 10 metres east of the same junction.
 - (v) MILE END ROAD (the south side) from a point 10 metres west of its junction with Crosslands Meadow in an easterly direction to a point 10 metres east of the same junction.
 - (vi) RAMBLERS CLOSE (both sides) from its junction with Mile End Road in a northerly direction for 10 metres.

As a result of the impact of COVID-19 and in accordance with Public Health England's advice on social distancing and avoiding non-essential trips, public buildings such at County Hall and libraries are closed or if reopened will have restrictions in place.

The double yellow lines are being introduced to remove parked vehicles from the 3 junctions off Mile End Road. The proposed restrictions will give better visibility for vehicles turning into or out of the junctions and will also give an unobstructed route for pedestrians to cross the road.

Written objections (stating grounds and quoting ref. 7234) must be received by me by the **25**th **September 2020**.
