COLWICK ROAD, ORSTON ROAD WEST, PAVILION ROAD AND TRENTSIDE NORTH, WEST BRIDGFORD NOTTINGHAM FOREST FOOTBALL GROUND EVENT DAY – TROS 8296 and 8297 WAITING, LOADING AND ACCESS RESTRICTIONS - REVISED PUBLIC CONSULTATION

As part of the scheme to prevent incursions by hostile vehicles at the Nottingham Forest Football Ground, Via East Midlands Ltd, working on behalf of Nottinghamshire County Council, is proposing to make changes to the Traffic Regulation Order proposals sent to residents at the beginning of May 2019.

The main change, as outlined in the letter sent out on 2nd August 2019, is to introduce an access permit scheme to allow residents access through the gates, off Radcliffe Road, at all times on an event day. On an event day the parking, loading and access restrictions would be in force on Monday to Friday between 6 and 10pm and on Bank Holidays, Saturdays and Sundays between 10am and 10pm. The gates/bollards would only be closed at the busiest periods, approximately 1 hour before the start of a football match and 45 minutes after the finish of the match.

The access permit scheme included in the current proposals would allow all eligible residents to buy one permit per property to be used with any vehicle registered at that property. The properties eligible to apply for a permit are shown on drawing H/JAB/3099/03. The permit would cost £10 and would require renewal every 12 months. It is expected that the permit would only be used when absolutely necessary to ensure that the gate is not being constantly opened. A permit would be free to all blue badge holding residents and to all residents over 75 years of age.

If the access permit scheme goes ahead then it is expected that all applicants would have to provide evidence of residency at the property. The access permit would be a different colour and appearance to the existing parking permits which are currently used in the residents parking schemes.

The only change to the previously advertised waiting and loading restrictions is on an event day when the restrictions would be in force on a Bank Holiday between 10am and 10pm. The extents of the restrictions are unchanged.

An information event will take place on Wednesday 4th December 2019 between 4pm and 7.30pm at the 1865 Suite, The City Ground off Pavilion Road. A representative from Nottingham Forest has been invited, to advise on the interface of the proposed Traffic Order with the ground redevelopment.
