

The Nottinghamshire County Council (Rempstone Road, East Leake) (40 M.P.H. Speed Limit) Order 2020 (8301)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Nottinghamshire County Council proposes to make an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, Traffic Management Act 2004, as amended, and The Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (County of Nottinghamshire) Designation Order 2008 (SI 2008 No. 1086), as amended, the effects of which will be to roads in East Leake in the Borough of Rushcliffe:-

Rempstone Road in East Leake in the Borough of Rushcliffe

1. from a point 40 metres north-west of its junction with Loughborough Road in a north-westerly direction to a point 25 metres south-east of its junction with Kirk Ley Road.

As a result of the impact of COVID-19 and in accordance with Public Health England's advice on social distancing and avoiding non-essential trips, public buildings such as County Hall and libraries are closed or if reopened will have restrictions in place.

To the north-west of the Loughborough Road junction it is proposed to introduce a 40mph speed limit. The limit would start from near the junction and extend in a north-westerly direction to finish at the start of the existing 30mph speed limit. The new limit would reflect the changing nature of the road with the new housing development on Rempstone Road. The 40mph would reduce the speed of traffic approaching the 30mph speed limit.

The Written objections (stating grounds and quoting ref. 8301) must be received by me by the **17th day of July 2020**.

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
