

The Nottinghamshire County Council (Roads off Hurricane Road, Lovesey Avenue and Shepherd Street, Hucknall) (20 M.P.H. Speed Limit) Order 2021 (4262)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Nottinghamshire County Council proposes to make an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, the effects of which will be to roads in Hucknall in the District of Ashfield:-

No person shall drive any vehicle at a speed exceeding 20 miles per hour on the following lengths of road in Hucknall in the District of Ashfield

1.
 - (i) Airfield Way – its whole length
 - (ii) Bellman Close – its whole length
 - (iii) Canberra Crescent – its whole length
 - (iv) Defiant Close – its whole length
 - (v) Griffon Drive – its whole length
 - (vi) Harker Close – its whole length
 - (vii) Hunter Drive – its whole length
 - (viii) Hurricane Road – its whole length
 - (ix) Lightning Grove – its whole length
 - (x) Lovesey Avenue – from a point 28 metres south-east of the outer perimeter of the roundabout junction with Watnall Road (B6009) in a south-easterly and then a north-easterly direction to a point 110 metres north-east of its junction with Griffon Drive.
 - (xi) Magee Close – its whole length
 - (xii) Meteor Road – its whole length
 - (xiii) Mosquito Grove – its whole length
 - (xiv) Mustang Close – its whole length
 - (xv) Nissan Mews – its whole length
 - (xvi) Pennington Way – its whole length
 - (xvii) Shepherd Street – from a point 21 metres south-east of the outer perimeter of the roundabout junction with Watnall Road (B6009) in a south-easterly direction to its junction with Lovesey Avenue.
 - (xviii) Spitfire Way – its whole length
 - (xvix) Turner Grove – its whole length

As a result of the impact of COVID-19 and in accordance with Public Health England's advice on social distancing and avoiding non-essential trips, public buildings such as County Hall and libraries are closed or if reopened will have restrictions in place.

The proposed 20mph speed limit is to reflect the residential nature of the roads. The roads are traffic calmed to ensure that vehicles drive at the speed limit. The speed limit will help improve road safety for all road users especially cyclists and pedestrians.
