

THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (BIRDCROFT LANE, WALKERINGHAM)(ONE WAY STREETS AND NO ENTRY PROHIBITION) TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER 2020 (1245)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Nottinghamshire County Council HAS MADE an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, the effects of which will be to roads in Walkeringham in the District of Bassetlaw:-

1. Birdcroft Lane, Walkeringham – one way street

Make the road one way on the east-west section of Birdcroft Lane. One way to go from the corner in a westerly direction to the junction with Beckingham Road.

2. Birdcroft Lane and Beckingham Road, Walkeringham – No Entry

No vehicle shall be permitted to enter Birdcroft Lane from Beckingham Road.

As a result of the impact of COVID-19 and in accordance with Public Health England's advice on social distancing and avoiding non-essential trips, public buildings such as County Hall and libraries are closed or if reopened will have restrictions in place.

The prohibition has been introduced to stop right turning vehicles from waiting on Beckingham Road before turning into Birdcroft Lane as waiting vehicles are not easily seen by approaching traffic. The visibility of the turning vehicles is restricted by the bends to the north and south of the junction. It is anticipated that the number of vehicles wanting to turn will increase due to the construction of additional residential properties on Birdcroft Lane.
