

<u>The Nottinghamshire County Council (Ley Lane and Pennine Close, Mansfield Woodhouse)</u> (Prohibition of Waiting and Parking Places) Traffic Regulation Order 2019 (2225)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Nottinghamshire County Council proposes to make an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, Traffic Management Act 2004, as amended, and The Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (County of Nottinghamshire) Designation Order 2008 (SI 2008 No. 1086), as amended, the effects of which will be, in respects of roads at Mansfield Woodhouse in the District of Mansfield:-

1. Vehicles will be prohibited from waiting at any time along the following: -

LEY LANE (MANSFIELD WOODHOUSE) (the south-east side)

• from a point 10 metres north-east of its junction with Pennine Close in a southwesterly direction to a point 10 metres south-west of that junction

PENNINE CLOSE (MANSFIELD WOODHOUSE) (the north-east side)

• from its junction with Ley Lane in a south-easterly direction for 10 metres

PENNINE CLOSE (MANSFIELD WOODHOUSE) (the south-west side)

- from its junction with Ley Lane in a south-easterly direction for 10 metres
- 2. Residents' parking bay operational Monday to Friday between the hours of 8am and 5pm along the following:-

LEY LANE (MANSFIELD WOODHOUSE) (the north-west side)

• from a point opposite a point 2 metres south-west of the south-western kerbline of Durham Close in a south-westerly direction for 27 metres
