

THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (CONISTON ROAD, KENDAL CLOSE & KESWICK ROAD WORKSOP) (20MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2023 (1267)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Nottinghamshire County Council **has made** an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, Traffic Management Act 2004, as amended, and The Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (County of Nottinghamshire) Designation Order 2008 (SI 2008 No. 1086), as amended, the effects of which will be to roads in Worksop in the District of Bassetlaw:-

Lengths of Roads shall become a 20mph speed limit

- **Coniston Road, Worksop**
From its southeast junction with Keswick Road in a westerly and then northerly direction to its northwest junction with Keswick Road.
- **Kendal Close, Worksop**
From its junction with Keswick Road in a northerly and then westerly direction to its western extremity.
- **Keswick Road, Worksop**
From its junction with Carlton Road in a westerly and then north westerly direction to its north westerly extremity Coniston Road.

The new 20mph speed limit replaces the existing 30mph Speed Limit and is required so that the speed limit reflects the character of the road and improves the perception of road safety.
