

**THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL**  
**(B6326 GREAT NORTH ROAD AND STAPLE LANE, BALDERTON AND**  
**MIDDLEBECK WAY, NEWARK)**  
**(PROPOSED 40 M.P.H. SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2025 (3395)**

The Council of the County of Nottinghamshire ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 81, 82(2), 83(2), 84(1) and 84(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act"), and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:-

1. No person shall drive any vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour on the lengths of road specified in the Schedule of this Order.
2. Any previous speed limit order made under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or any enactment replaced by that Act in so far as it related to the lengths of road specified in the Schedules to this Order is hereby revoked.
3. This Order may be cited as "THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (B6326 GREAT NORTH ROAD AND STAPLE LANE, BALDERTON AND MIDDLEBECK WAY, NEWARK) (PROPOSED 40 M.P.H. SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2025 (3395)" and shall come into force on the **25<sup>th</sup>** day of **April 2025**.


**Staple Lane, Balderton**

- From a point 135 metres south-west of the Middlebeck Way - Staple Lane roundabout, in a north-easterly direction to its junction with B6326 Great North Road roundabout, including the entire circulatory of the Middlebeck Way - Staple Lane roundabout and the Great North Road roundabout.

**Middlebeck Way, Newark On Trent**

- From its junction with the Middlebeck Way - Staple Lane roundabout, in a north-westerly direction for 120 metres.
