## B600 NOTTINGHAM ROAD, NUTHALL (EAST OF WATNALL ROAD), PROPOSED RESIDENTS' PARKING RESTRICTIONS (AT ANY TIME ) - PUBLIC ADVERT

Via East Midlands is working on behalf of Nottinghamshire County Council to deliver highway services. Nottinghamshire County Council have received requests to consider implementing a parking scheme to remove long-term non-residential parking on B600 Nottingham Road, in the parking bay east of Watnall Road at Nuthall, where most of the properties do not have access to any off-street parking

Further to the initial consultation letter of 29<sup>th</sup> September 2023, the next stage of the consultation is to publicly advertise the scheme. The advert will be published in the Nottingham Post and notices will be fixed on site. A plan showing the extents of the 'Residents Parking Scheme' is attached (Drawing Number H/SLW/4257/02 along with a copy of the Site Notice.

Any observations on these proposals should reach me in writing, either by letter or email, **19<sup>th</sup> April 2024**. If your comments are in the form of an objection to the proposals please clearly state this and the reasons for your objection. If the objection cannot be resolved, it will be reported through the County Council's procedures at the appropriate time.

The introduction of a residents' parking scheme would allow residents to continue parking on street, but would prevent all day commuter / shopper parking. Parking by residents and their visitors would be controlled by permits. However, a permit would not guarantee a space directly outside a person's property and at busy times may not guarantee a space within the controlled area.

It is County Council policy to charge for ALL permits issued. Permits would cost £38 each and will usually be valid for 12 months, with 100% discount concessions for Blue Badge Holders and residents 75 years old and over.
