<u>CHAPEL STREET AREA, BRAMCOTE - PROPOSED PARKING RESTRICTIONS - DOUBLE YELLOW LINES AND BUS STOP CLEARWAYS (TRO 5362) - STAGE 2 CONSULTATION</u>

Via East Midlands Ltd is working on behalf of Nottinghamshire County Council to deliver Highway Services.

Concerns have been raised regarding inconsiderate and obstructive parking along Chapel Street at its junctions with Chapel Mews Court and Town Street. This is causing visibility issues at these junctions. To address this issue, it is proposed to introduce double yellow lines ('No Waiting At Any Time') restrictions around the junction. It is also proposed to introduce two new 19 metre Bus Stop Clearways to be in operation 24 hours.

Further to the second consultation letter of 13th December 2024, the next stage of the consultation is to publicly advertise the scheme. The advert will be published in the Nottingham Post and notices will be fixed on site. A plan showing the proposals is attached (Drawing Number H/JW/4830/01) along with a copy of the site notice.

The County Council works closely with all public transport operators across the County to identify bus stops that suffer from inconsiderate parking. At the location above a bus stop clearway is to be installed that prohibits other vehicles from parking or waiting in the bus stops at the times specified and these will be clearly identified with new road markings and signage. The main benefits of bus stop clearways is to:

- Help the bus align with the kerb to enable better access for disabled passengers and pushchair users;
- Ease congestion as a correctly aligned bus will not block the road for other road users;
- Ensure that bus drivers discharge their duty to drop passengers off on the kerb and not on the road:
- Ensure that bus services operate on time and are not unnecessarily delayed.

Any objections should clearly state the reasons for the objections and should reach us in writing, either by letter or email, by 1st April 2025. If the objection cannot be resolved, it will be reported through the County Council's procedures at the appropriate time.
