**THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (COTGRAVE ROAD,
NORMANTON THE WOLDS AND PLUMTREE AND CHURCH HILL, PLUMTREE)**
(50MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2021 (8306)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Nottinghamshire County Council **Has Made** an order under the road traffic regulation act 1984, the effects of which will be, in respects of roads at Normanton on the Wolds and Plumtree in the Borough of Rushcliffe -

1. No person shall drive any vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on: -

Cotgrave Road, Normanton on the Wolds

From its junction with A606 Melton Road in a north-easterly then northerly then north-easterly direction to a point 490 metres south-west of the centre line of Cotgrave Lane.

Cotgrave Road, Plumtree

From its junction with A606 Melton Road in a south-westerly direction to its junction with Church Hill

Church Hill, Plumtree

From its junction with Cotgrave Road in a westerly direction for 67 metres

2. Any previous speed limit order made under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or any enactment replaced by that Act in so far as it related to the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order is hereby revoked.
